
Inside Our Doors

Mennonite Church Canada

In the last half of October, the island of Mindanao in the Philippines experienced a series of earthquakes, one of which, reached a magnitude of 6.5, killing eight people. So far 6,000 people are displaced. Mennonite Church Canada Witness workers Dann and Joji Pantoja, who minister in the area, are safe but continue to feel aftershocks. Their organization, PeaceBuilders Community, Inc., is delivering donated water, food and clothing to people in the mountainous regions. They ask for prayer for injured and displaced people.
