- **3.** Communion: On December 1, the first Sunday of Advent, we will celebrate communion as we prepare ourselves for the birth of Christ.
- 4. The Senior Youth of Home Street and Sargent churches are exploring the possibility of an inter-generational service trip with Mennonite Disaster Service. The destination would be Wharton, Texas. - 5. Advent Giving Project This Advent season, Home Street will be collecting money for two climate action initiatives. Half of the funds raised will go towards our church's Climate Action Building Fund, a fund designated for projects that will "green" our building and conserve energy. The other half of the funds will go towards Conservation Agriculture in Kenya, a initiative of Mennonite Central Committee and the Utooni Development Organization. Conservation Agriculture is one way that people in Kenya are coping with increased dry spells and droughts due to climate change. By learning techniques such as soil cover and crop rotation, as well as diversifying livestock, Kenyan farmers are better able to sustain themselves year-round.
