5. **Faith & Membership:** Even as we make adjustments to life with Covid, our faith in God continues to grow and our connection with the faith community becomes even more important. So if you are at a point in your faith where you are considering baptism, or at a point in your connection with Home Street where you have questions about becoming a member, please get in touch with Phil or Judith. Faith and membership conversations will be planned to accommodate those who are interested.
6. **Finance Update:** Our financial position remains relatively strong this year, with donations totaling \$177,279 and total general revenue totaling \$192,284 by the end of September (this includes additional revenue such as rent). Our budget for the year is around \$284,000, so we have raised about two-thirds of our annual budget so far. Thank you to everyone for sharing your financial gifts with the church this year.

This month we sent our quarterly contribution to Mennonite Church Manitoba and Westgate Mennonite Collegiate. Sending these gifts is a reminder to me that our donations to Home Street not only support the work of our congregation, but the important work of the broader church.

We still hope to raise a third of our budget in the last few months of the year and ask you to continue to give as you are able to support the work of Home Street Mennonite Church. Donations can be made by cheque or cash, e-transfer, pre-authorized contributions, or through CanadaHelps.

A note to donors:

Leadership Council recently determined that HSMC would shift away from accepting credit card donations via PayPal. PayPal does not provide services to Palestinians living under Israeli occupation in the West Bank and Gaza, even though it does serve illegal Israeli settlements within the occupied territories. PayPal's practice goes counter to the vision of justice and peace that our congregation supports through Mennonite Church Manitoba's Working Group on Palestine/Israel.
