

1. **Due to the rising cases of COVID-19 in the community**, the Pandemic Guidance Group has decided to move this Sunday's service (January 2) onto Zoom. Although public health guidelines allow us to meet with limited capacity, we have made this decision out of care and concern for our community, our health care system, and the many dedicated people who work in health care. We anticipate moving back to our livestreamed format as soon as it feels safe to have a worship leading team of 10 or so people sharing the sanctuary. 2. **Home Street Youth** – gather this Friday evening, January 7, from 7:30-9pm for a Zoom games night. Snacks will be delivered to your homes. A Zoom link will arrive by email.
3. **Adult Education:** Germinating Conversations: Food, Faith, Farming, and the Land (Led by Marta Bunnett Wiebe and Steve Plenert) Do you remember the last time you ate? Chances are that you do because eating is something we all do pretty much every day. So much so that maybe you don't even give eating a lot of thought. You just do it! However, food, farming, and eating all have profound spiritual, ecological, social, and political aspects to them. Join us as we look at values such as peace and the earth in our Adult Ed series drawing on the book Germinating Conversations: Stories from a Sustained Rural-Urban Dialogue on Food, Faith, Farming, and the Land. Led by the book's editor and one of the contributors, we will listen and dialogue about the gifts and challenges that growing and eating present, explore the practical role of food in a climate emergency, and practice engaging well with one another in dialogue.

All sessions will take place on Wednesday evenings 7:00- 8:00, via Zoom.
