9. **Saturday, March 4 at 5:00pm** in the CMU Lecture Hall: Come out to the **Manitoba premiere of the film *Custodians***, a remarkable story about learning to preserve and promote the historical Indigenous land on which we live. This documentary film follows the journey of the small town of Herschel, Saskatchewan, who came together to form what is now the "Ancient Echoes" interpretive centre. The CMU PCTS-3600 class (which includes some Home Streeters) is putting on the viewing of this movie, followed by a discussion with David Neufeld, one of the makers of the movie, to ask the question: "How can we pursue creative peacebuilding in areas of Indigenous-settler relations and ecological nurturing?" Refreshments will be provided.
10. **A spring equinox sweat lodge ceremony** will take place at Sandy-Saulteaux Spiritual Centre on March 19, at 11:00 am, followed by a potluck feast.
