8. May 5, 2024: Indigenous Peoples Sunday

On May 5, we will mark Indigenous Peoples Sunday in our worship at HSMC. This is the annual service, planned by the Indigenous Settler Relations Group, to celebrate the contribution of Indigenous Peoples to our community and to learn from their wisdom.

This year, our guest speaker will be Niigaan Sinclair -- professor and head of the Department of Native Studies at the University of Manitoba, columnist, author and activist. Our friends Beatrice and Cheryl-Anne from St. Kateri Aboriginal Catholic Parish will provide drumming and singing and will also offer smudging outdoors prior to the service (starting at 10:15) to whomever wishes to participate. (Smudging is the practice of cleansing oneself and connecting with Creator through the burning of sacred medicines, such as sage, sweetgrass, cedar or tobacco.) If you are planning to smudge, please come early.

May 5 is also Red Dress Day which is a national day to honour Indigenous women, girls and gender diverse individuals who have been murdered or gone missing. We will have a red dress as part of the altar display.

A potluck will follow the service, and will include traditional Bannock.

- -woodcrafts created by Henry Neufeld, symbolizing his love of the outdoors and the longstanding relationships he and his family developed with Indigenous Peoples over 70+ years
- -honey produced by bees in cooperation with Gordon Janzen,
